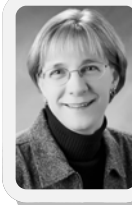

COURSE ABSTRACT

Children with Childhood Apraxia of Speech (CAS) often have co-existing difficulties in areas other than speech. The interaction of speech and language in early development means that many (most) children with CAS will have co-occurring language problems, including potential difficulty with social-pragmatic aspects of language. It is well documented in the research literature that children with early speech-language problems are at higher risk for later literacy (reading and writing) difficulties. There are also reports in the literature that children with apraxia may have more generalized motor incoordination and/or sensory issues. Some children with apraxia will have difficulty with initiating and sequencing actions to complete tasks, in the realm of executive functioning skills. Intervention for children with CAS may need to include techniques for addressing skills in a variety of areas in addition to work on speech. In this workshop, we will begin by briefly discussing characteristics of appropriate treatment for CAS and then move into discussion of co-existing issues and strategies for managing those issues. A case study approach will be used, with practical strategies for children of all ages included.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

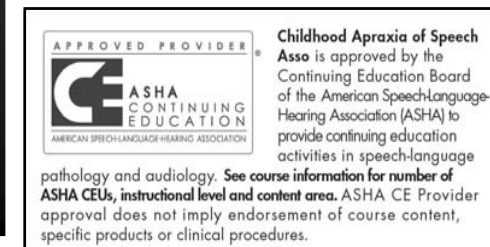
At the end of this course participants will be able to:

- 2) Describe how parents can support development of executive functioning skills.
- 3) Identify how sensory and general motor issues can affect progress in speech therapy.
- 4) Explain how technology can be used to support both communication and academic skills.
- 5) Describe how literacy skills can be integrated into speech therapy.

COURSE LEVEL

Intermediate/Professional Area. Participants are expected to have some prior academic and/or clinical experience with children with severe speech disorders. Families are most welcome at the workshop with the understanding that the level of presentation will be at the intermediate professional level.
