Having a sibling is a lifetime relationship. Brothers and sisters can offer each other a lifetime of support and friendship, but having a brother or sister with childhood apraxia of speech can affect the entire family. It's not always easy being the sibling of a child with special needs and this workshop will celebrate the relationship between siblings and acknowledge the difficulties that can exist. This 1 ½ hour workshop facilitated by David Hammer, M.A., CCC-SLP will offer information on CAS, discussion and activities for siblings of children diagnosed with CAS. Children ages 8 to 16 will make new friends and find support from other kids with siblings with CAS.
