COURSE ABSTRACT

The Kaufman Speech to Language Protocol evaluation and treatment approach will be demonstrated during this workshop. Elements of shaping word approximations and the use of phonological processes in therapy as well as cueing systems will be highlighted via video. This effective method for children with apraxia of speech will be shared in a functional manner, with many tips and suggestions clinicians and parents can use immediately!

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

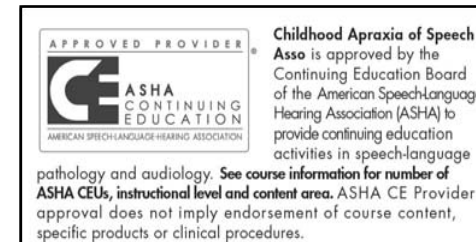
At the end of this course participants will be able to:

- Be able to analyze video to establish goals per this approach.
- Understand and analyze a norm-referenced, standardized test which relates directly to this approach in order to identify this unique population of children.
